BACKGROUND

The purpose of this Memorandum is to confirm the parties' intention to collaborate in an online cohort study of gay and bisexual men. It will identify risk factors for and prevalence and incidence of, drug use and associated harms within this high risk population; the role of gay community norms in individuals' beliefs about and motivations for drug use; and implications for HIV and HCV infection. FLUX NZ is a New Zealand arm of the main study FLUX Australia 2018. FLUX Australia has previously received funding from an Australian Research Council grant and from Gilead and Associate Professor Prestage and Dr Hammoud are supported by the Kirby Centre, UNSW. In NZ, Dr Saxton's involvement is supported by the New Zealand AIDS Foundation Fellowship, and Mr Andrews' involvement is supported by the NZ Drug Foundation and the University of Auckland.

 - a. **The Lead Australian Institution** will be responsible for overall study lead and oversight, data hosting, dataset management and dataset access. The use, analysis, interpretation and publication of all New Zealand-based responses held by the Lead Australian Institution must have the involvement and approval of the Lead NZ Institution.
 - b. **The Lead NZ Institution** will be responsible for coordinating the New Zealand arm through the following activities: questionnaire adaptation, local ethical review, local stakeholder consultation, local participant portal design, local study promotion and local dissemination. The Lead NZ Institution may delegate any of the above activities to local partner organisations by mutual agreement. The Lead NZ Institution will provide the Lead Australian Institution with input by a New Zealand researcher on all New Zealand-based or joint proposed analyses. The Lead NZ Institution will be responsible for seeking and incorporating feedback from the New Zealand-based partners on all aspects of FLUX NZ.
 - c. **The NZ Partner Organisations** will be responsible for providing input into FLUX NZ when requested by the Lead Australian Institution or the Lead NZ Institution and for completing any delegated mutually agreed activities.
2. The parties do not intend this Memorandum to be legally binding.


